

n 6th and 7th February, the prestigious CESTour conference was organised in collaboration with Nine Partner Universities - FH JOANNEUM University of Applied Sciences, Graz (Austria), University of Alicante, Alicante (Spain) ,Universitá di Linguee Comunicazione, IULM University, Milan (Italy) , Institute of Public Enterprise, Hyderabad (India) Nirma University, Ahmedabad (India) Sabaragamuwa University of Sri Lanka, Belihuloya (Sri Lanka) UvaWellassa University, Badulla (Sri Lanka) , Tribhuvan University, Kathmandu (Nepal), and Global College International, Kathmandu (Nepal).

In the spirit of international collaboration, we received a wealth of 81 insightful contributions in the form of abstracts, cases, and papers from distinguished researchers and practitioners hailing from diverse corners of the globe – Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Nepal, Italy, Singapore, and India. The geographical diversity represented here underscores the global significance of sustainable tourism as a shared responsibility that transcends borders. As we embark on this intellectual journey, the theme of the conference, 'Navigating the Future of Sustainable Tourism'; resonates with the pressing need to weave together economic prosperity, environmental stewardship, and community well-being. From innovative case studies to thought-provoking academic papers, a wide range of ideas were received in six discussion tracks and 12 tracks for paper presentation which undoubtedly broadened perspectives and inspired meaningful action.







The event started by greeting the Keynote Speakers; Dr. Jarrkko Saarinen, University of Oulu, (Finland), Dr. Harald Friedl, FH Joanneum (Austria), and Mr. Vinod Zutshi, Industry Consultant and Advisor (India). The speakers highlighted the importance of Sustainable Tourism and its aspects emphasising the well-being of our planet, the prosperity of our economies, and the enrichment of our communities. The highlight of the conference was the launch of CESTour promotional video and the release of the book titled Sustainable Development in South Asia Tourism: Best Practices from CESTour's Centers of Excellence.

The two-day event schedule included Technical Sessions, Case Presentations, Industry Discussion and a research workshop. The topics for these sessions revolved around Policy, People, Environment and Health associated with Sustainable Tourism.

KODECET PROJECT LEADS THE WAY IN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

e have taken a significant step towards advancing the field of sustainable development through involvement in the Knowledge Development for Circular Economy Transition (KODECET) project. This Erasmus+ funded initiative by the European Union (EU) represents a collaborative effort between six higher education institutions (HEIs) aimed at addressing crucial knowledge gaps and capacity limitations in the domain of sustainability and circular economy.

The KODECET project specifically targets India and Thailand emerging markets that stand to benefit immensely from the development of a skilled workforce and accessible educational resources in circular economy practices. By leveraging digital technologies, the project strives to provide faculty and students with cost-free learning opportunities, ultimately facilitating a knowledge-driven transition towards more sustainable practices.

Participation in this prestigious initiative signifies our position as a frontrunner in India's sustainability efforts. The institute joins forces with five other HEIs: University of Jyväskylä (Finland), FH JOANNEUM (Austria), Nirma University Ahmedabad (India), Prince of Songkla University (Thailand), and Payap University (Thailand). Through this collaboration, the partner institutions aim to cultivate a well-equipped workforce by enhancing knowledge, training faculty and researchers, developing relevant courses and certifications, and establishing a digital center for resource dissemination.

The first kick-off meeting, held at Payap University (Thailand) from January 22nd to 25th, 2024, served as a platform for discussing work packages and charting the course forward. Professor Rahul Singh and Dr. Anupama Singh represented BIMTECH at this crucial gathering.

Furthermore, BIMTECH's role as India's representative in this groundbreaking project is a noteworthy achievement. The Center for Social Impact at Payap University also organized a study tour that included visits to three exemplary social enterprises. These included Poopoo paper, a community business that upcycles elephant dung into paper products; Amravati Wellness, a business promoting traditional Indo-Thai wellness practices; and Free Bird Café Social Enterprise, a zerowaste establishment that supports local women-led businesses.

BIMTECH's leadership in the KODECET project exemplifies our unwavering commitment to fostering sustainable development practices. Through knowledge sharing, capacity building, and collaborative efforts, the project paves the way for a more sustainable future in India and Thailand.



2ND ANNUAL CONVOCATION FOR PGDM (ONLINE) BATCH

UNLOCKING DIVERSITY, IGNITING SUSTAINABILITY: **BIMTECH'S INDIA STUDY PROGRAM**

The 'India Study Program', a short-term immersion initiative, was organized by the Centre for International Affairs from February 11th to 20th, 2024, targeting Master's students from FH Vorarlberg, Austria, with a thematic focus on 'Diversity and Sustainable Development in India'. The program was meticulously designed to provide participants from diverse backgrounds with a comprehensive understanding of India's multifaceted approach to addressing environmental, social, and economic challenges. Through a blend of classroom sessions, interactive discussions, and insightful field visits, participants delved into the intricacies of sustainable development practices across various sectors, thereby nurturing global perspectives and fostering innovation for a better tomorrow. As executive learners from varied backgrounds converged, they established cross-cultural ties, nurturing a global outlook essential for navigating challenges. This program serves to ignite enthusiasm for sustainable development and cultural understanding, empowering future leaders to effect positive change.



STRONG BUSINESS, STRONGER CSR **SOCIAL PROJECT (RURAL IMMERSION)**



"The soul of India lives in its villages," declared Mahatma Gandhi. One, characterized by ultra-urbanization and rapid growth, stands in stark contrast to the Rural, where the essence of the nation thrives. Guided by Prof. KK Upadhyay of the Centre for Sustainability & CSR, 329 PGDM students, along with Professors and Managers, including international participants from Zimbabwe and Syria, embarked on a distinctive initiative. Their objective: to delve into the villages of Gautam Buddha Nagar, gaining insights into rural life and understanding the challenges faced by the local populace.

Organized into 10 groups, the students visited various villages, including Jamalpur, Dhoom Manikpur, Badhpura, Bisahra, Uncha Amir Pur, Piyawali Deri, Rasul Pur Dasna, Khadar Jewar, Kot, and Kalonda. They engaged with the residents, immersing themselves in the intricacies of their daily struggles. A pivotal aspect of their exploration involved interaction with Self Help Groups (SHGs) to grasp their functioning, issues, and challenges. Additionally, the students conducted one-on-one conversations with villagers and participated in community transect walks, contributing to resource mapping endeavours.

Throughout their visit, the students actively interacted with villagers, addressing crucial issues, such as, healthcare, education, livelihood, SHGs, and Water, Sanitation, and

Hygiene (WASH). Through dialogues and surveys, distinct challenges surfaced in each village, ranging from limited healthcare accessibility and educational resource inadequacies to livelihood constraints and SHG empowerment. These interactions and community engagements played a pivotal role in understanding and analysing the unique needs of each village.

This engagement not only provided students with insights into rural life, but also, nurtured the development of valuable qualities such as empathy, problem-solving skills, and creative thinking. Beyond mere identification of problems, the students actively pursued solutions. Collaborating with villagers and various livelihood groups, they generated practical and constructive ideas aimed at enhancing village life. They shared their discoveries with one another and engaged in discussions with experienced professionals from Village Square and U-Turn.

This transformative experience instilled a sense of responsibility in the students, empowering them to contribute meaningfully towards creating a better world. It represents a significant step towards building a brighter and more equitable future for all, in line with the ethos of "Leaving" No One Behind" and achieving Sustainable Development Goals by 2023.

Majlis-The Debating and Theatre Society is eternally conscious of creating knowledge sharing platforms to connect our Gen-Z with the rich cultural heritage of our country. To nurture global leaders with deep rooted values, Majlis organized a leadership talk by eminent author, diplomat, Member of Parliament and former ambassador-Mr. Pavan K Varma. Today, the world needs knowledge leaders, and learning from renowned visionaries is a blessing for the future corporate citizens that BIMTECH nurtures. Mr. Varma delivered a captivating and enlightening session on INDIA'S MATHEMATICAL LEGACY IN ANCIENT CIVILIZATIONS on February 14th, 2024, delving into India's profound heritage and intellectual legacy. With eloquence and passion, Mr. Kumar highlighted the essence and diversity of the Indian Knowledge System, emphasizing the importance of rediscovering and preserving India's ancient wisdom, particularly in mathematics.

Mr. Kumar's session transported the audience through time, unraveling the rich tapestry of India's intellectual heritage. From Vedic philosophies to Aryabhata's mathematical genius, he showcased India's remarkable contributions to mathematics and philosophy. He urged the audience to view India's heritage, not as static, but as a dynamic guide for addressing contemporary challenges.



"India is a young nation but an ancient civilization."

Central to Mr. Kumar's discourse was the recognition of India's ancient civilization, which has endured through time despite encountering various paradoxes. He emphasized India's mathematical legacy, tracing its roots back to the Indus Valley Civilization and highlighting significant advancements during the classical period. Scholars like Aryabhata and Brahmagupta, inspired by celestial phenomena, revolutionized mathematical concepts, such as, the decimal system, zero, and algebra.

His articulation and extemporaneous style captivated the audience, as Mr. Gupta underscored the importance of understanding India's cultural and civilizational heritage. He debunked the theory of Aryan invasion, emphasizing that it was not an invasion but a habitation, thus reshaping historical narratives. He discussed the Rigveda and its significance, particularly mentioning the Saraswati River, which is mentioned 72 times in the Rigveda, flowing from the Himalayas to the Arabian Sea.

Highlighting the importance of the Saraswati River, Mr. Kumar emphasized its role in India's ancient civilization and the need to predate the origins of Indian civilization, by at least 2000 years before BC. He emphasized the importance of recognizing India as a young nation with an ancient civilization, where the structural framework of the nation emerged only in the 18th and 19th centuries, while its heritage and civilization date back millennia.

Mr. Kumar, said that "writing serves as a voltage stabilizer" in his life, enabling him to delve deeper into the remarkable foundations of India's great civilization. Through compassion, sustainability, and a deep reverence for India's intellectual legacy, Mr. Kumar envisioned a harmonious future guided by ancient wisdom and modern insights. His talk resonated deeply with the students and faculty; and was successful inigniting curiosity and reminding the audience of India's living heritage, which continues to shape destinies for generations to come.

IN RM PROGRAM





The On-job Training (OJT) of PGDM Retail Management Program (2023-25 batch) took place from 8th January 2024 to 7th February 2024 in the Delhi-NCR region.

The OJT is a part of the RM program and bridges the gap between theory and practice to make the students future ready. This year the OJT entailed 62 students,9 different brands, 26 retail stores, 31 days on the shop floor. Brands like Arrow, Flying Machine, Lifestyle, Shoppers Stop, Reliance Smart Bazaar, Pantaloons, Reliance Smart, U S Polo, and US Polo Kids partnered with BIMTECH to provide this training. Our retail students withstood the hands-on learning rigour of the shop floor and the challenges of working in real-time retail ecosystem. The students' performance assessment was through store evaluation, presence in the store, faculty mentor's store visit, the report submitted, and, last but not the least, the rigorous OJT viva by external industry experts. The students have emerged wiser, more grounded and confident on the subjects post the on-job training. They are ready to take on the world in their stride.

The On-job training (OJT) odyssey of Retail Management program studentsis their deep dive into the retail realm, wherein they learn the ropes of retail in action much beyond shelves and sales. The OJT is an integral part of the RM program curriculum which allows students to transform from retail novices to retail navigating professionals, apply theoretical concepts into practice; and imparts students with much-needed exposure and gain insights into how an actual store operates. Beyond the daily

tasks, the store became a hub for building connections. The fast-paced environment, coupled with the mentorship and camaraderie, turns the one-month stint into a transformative experience.

WORKSHOP: RIGOR AND RELEVANCE IN ACADEMIC PAPER DEVELOPMENT



The Centre for Research Studies (CRS) organized a one-day workshop on 'Rigor and Relevance in Academic Paper Development' on Saturday December 9, 2023. The workshop was conducted by Dr. Atul Parvatiyar, Professor of practice, Marketing and Supply Chain Management, Rawls College of business, Texas Tech University and Dr. Ankit Anand, Assistant Professor, Marketing, Rawls College of business, Texas Tech University.

The workshop began with ceremonial welcome of the resource persons by the research scholars of BIMTECH. Pre-lunch sessions were conducted by Dr. Parvatiyar in which he spoke at length about conceptualization, topic selection, theoretical and conceptual models used in research papers, etc. He also touched upon fundamental aspects of research, such as, ontology and epistemology, which are often misunderstood by the researchers. The session ended with questions and answers.

Post-lunch sessions were conducted by Dr. Ankit Anand, who explored the concept of endogeneity in regression models and how to reduce it. He also talked about 'quasi experimental research' and related it with public policy, citing that researchers must have an interest in giving back to the society through their work; and, therefore, must explore the idea of public policy research where quasi-experimental methods are a good fit. Dr. Anand also

discussed bringing rigor in research paper. During the Q&A session, he satisfied the queries of the participants at length. The workshop came to an end with a formal vote of thanks to the resource persons for sharing their time and knowledge with the participants. A few faculty members were also present in the workshop as participants.

RURAL IMMERSION PROGRAM

PGDM-IB Program Batch 2023-25



To increase students' awareness and gain hands-on experience and insights, the students of PGDM-IB batch 2023-25 got a glimpse of various CSR interventions of Dabur India Limited in Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh.

They got to witness the transformation of a local village pond by Dabur India Limitedand even participated in a plantation drive at the development site.

They were also taken on a tour of the villages in the district to interact with the beneficiaries of various CSR interventions like Self-Help Groups (SHGs), computer literacy program, and vocational training, to name a few.

The itinerary included:

Site 1: Visit to Dabur Water Conservation Project to understand the Pond Renovation work at Dasna undertaken by Dabur India.

Site 2: Visit to Dabur's NGO – 'Sundesh' Site wherein students met Dabur's team consisting of Field Staff and Sundesh's staff members.

The team addressed and interacted with the students and then they visited the 'Project Village'.

Here the students were exposed to: Village Self-Help Groups, Education interventions and Skill Development Centre of Dabur.PGDM-IB students were able to relate to efforts of Dabur CSR activities around three core areas, i.e. education, women empowerment and sustainable environmental initiatives. Students visited self-help groups promoting women entrepreneurship, aided schools and community initiatives such as organic farms, supported by Dabur.

While public sector undertakings previously did CSR on a voluntary basis, India's Companies Act of 2013 made it mandatory for certain companies. This legislation applies to companies exceeding specific financial thresholds: turnover of Rs. 1000 crore, net worth of Rs. 500 crore, or net profit of Rs. 5 Crore. These companies are required to form a dedicated CSR committee or board, mandated by SEBI to report on their CSR activities. This committee plays a key role in determining the budget, projects, and implementation of CSR initiatives for the following year. It also monitors progress and ensures compliance with regulations. The Board of Directors (BOD) is responsible for implementing the CSR committee's plans and decisions. A minimum of 2% of the company's average net profit for the preceding three years, as calculated according to Companies Act Section 18, must be allocated to CSR activities.

The students had a great full day visit and they understood that CSR initiatives ensures a meaningful and sustainable contribution to society. They interacted with ladies from Self Help Groups and NGOs, and saw all the facilities.

VISIT TO INLAND CONTAINER DEPOT, TUGLAKABAD BY PGDM-IB STUDENTS









Students of PGDM-International Business (Batch 2023-25) visited and interacted with officials of ICD Tuglakabad, New Delhi. ICD Tuglakabad (ICD Tkd), is considered one of the busiest dry ports in India, handling container traffic for the country's northern hinterland. ICD serves as a dry port and a key logistics hub in the northern region, providing connectivity between domestic and global supply chains.

The Container Corporation of India Ltd (CONCOR), a Public Sector Undertaking, is entrusted with the management of this ICD. CONCOR, not only oversees the ICD Tuglakabad, but also functions as the rail carrier for import and export containers, facilitating seamless transportation between the ICD and the Gateway Ports of Mumbai, NhavaSheva, and Chennai. Within the Customs area, there are two dedicated covered sheds—one for handling imports and the other for exports. This comprehensive infrastructure ensures efficient and organized handling of goods, further solidifying ICD Tuglakabad's position as a key player in the logistics and trade network of the region.

Students were divided into groups and taken to the whole facility by CONCOR and Customs officials, including export and import warehouses and railway siding. ICD Tkdis connected to the railway with four railway lines network for seamless transportation of goods. The Customs officials explained the purpose of the customs seal which is placed at the bottom of containers and first checked by custom members and then containers are let in.



Some key points noted by students from the visit:

- The facility includes two dedicated warehouses: one for import and one for export goods. Containers arriving at the ICD are either stored in these warehouses or directly transported out
- The facility is not owned privately, but there are rental charges on basis of space per square feet or on basis of slabs
- When the container is kept in warehouse for more days, storage charges are borne by both importer and exporter
- Custom House Agent is responsible for filing all the documents. They act as a liaison between the importer/exporter and the customs authorities, ensuring that all necessary documentation is in order and that goods are properly classified and valued.
- Notably, the process at ICD Tuglakabad is known for its efficiency, typically taking a maximum of 4-5 hours to complete.
- The key licenses that are required are export-import license, packing list and shipping bill. Bill of entry is required in case of imports and shipping bill is required in case of exports
- The most commonly imported items in ICD Tuglakabad is auto parts, garments and some pharma items
- The facility also incorporates random checks on goods upon arrival at the warehouse
- Importer is provided duty benefits by government on basis
 of whether goods, on which benefit is claimed, are also
 covered under government notification. This is done by
 checking the bill of entry; and if duty is claimed wrongly by
 importer they face penalties related to it or even legal
 actions

 Some of the goods which come are not claimed by anyone and are blacklisted. Auction is conducted for such goods to recover the cost for customs. Goods which cannot be auctioned, for example, perishable goods like food, are disposed or destroyed. The cost of destruction is usually borne by the importer and in some cases by the custom department.

Despite the busy and hectic atmosphere, the visit to the dry port proved to be a crucial and insightful learning experience for our PGDM-IB program. Visit to Dry port is a crucial part of PGDM-IB journey and helps to grasp first-hand the various operations involved at an ICD. CONCOR and Custom officers gave our students first-hand experience from the time of entry of goods to ICD, filing first documents on IceGate, examination of goods at the warehouse, Container stuffing and sealing by Customs, final Let Export (LEO) and then loading of ISO containers on railway rakes meant for final exports from a seaport at JNPT, Mumbai or Mundra or Pipavav, Gujarat.


