BK Birla (1921-2019)

Late B K Birla ji A VISIONARY WHO INSPIRED US TO DREAM BIG!

he Birla family is distinguished by their long association with the education sector. It all started way back in the year 1900 when Seth Shiv Narayan Birla set up a primary school in Pilani. His two grandsons Rameshwar Das Birla and Ghanshyam Birla were among the first few students who started their education in the school. In the last 120 years, Birlas have set up hundreds of schools, colleges and universities in the country with the sole objective of providing quality education without any commercial motive. Our Founders & Patrons, both Late B K Birla ji and Dr (Smt) Sarala Birla ji have followed this legacy of their forefathers with deep commitment and long-term vision about education.

After the passing away of B K Birla ji on July 3, 2019 and Dr (Smt) Sarala Birla ji on March 28, 2015, J have been thinking about their benevolence, warrath and simplicity which have become the hallmark of their persona. I am fortunate to be working under them for the last two decades which has transformed my own life and thought process. Now BIMTECH has become a prominent B-School in India, which is well known both in India and abroad. But not many people know that idea of making it big would have not been possible without the unstinted support of our Founder & Patrons. After joining BIMTECH at its old campus in New Delhi on September 2, 1999, I started applying my mind as to how the institute could build its brand and attain visibility at the national level. Having known the growth trajectory of reputed B- Schools in India and worldwide, I could identify one primary raison d'etre i.e. a residential campus with the state-of-the-art facilities for students and faculty.

After wide consultation with leading management educationists, I prepared the 'Vision-2005' document and submitted it to the management. The major focus of this document was to build a residential campus with the objective of getting recognized among the top 25 B-Schools of India by the year 2005. It was necessary because our premises at Birla Vidya Niketan, Pushp Vihar, New Delhi was very modest and without residential facility.

My predecessor, Dr C B Gupta, a legendary academician (ex-Principal, SRCC, Delhi and Founder Director, IMT, Ghaziabad) was designated by the management as the Advisor. He advised me to move to DDA for getting a two acre plot in Delhi. DDA, being a typical bureaucratic body, was not willing to help us and dismissed the proposal on some flimsy legal objection.



n early January 2002, I saw an advertisement in India Today in which, the Greater Noida Authority (GNIDA) was offering institutional Iand for educational institutions. The matter was discussed with the management and I sought their permission to submit our application. Our advisor, Dr CB Gupta, was not in favour of moving the campus from New Delhi to Greater Noida, due to fears of losing the locational advantages of South Delhi.

Meantime, for expanding the geographic base of our student population, we had started hostels in rented premises at Sarvapriya Vihar and Devri Road. It was a tough decision and full of challenges. I continued to convince our management that having a residential campus was the sine-qua non for a good B-School and there was no harm in setting up a campus at Greater Noida which after all was a part of the National Capital Region (NCR).

We submitted an application for getting institutional land from the GNIDA at Knowledge Park in the last week of January, 2002. At that time, there were hardly a few institutions in Greater Noida and reaching the city was also difficult because the Expressway was not fully functional and access through Dadri – Surajpur side was always cumbersome.

When GNIDA called us for a meeting to make a presentation about our plans for setting up a campus in

Greater Noida, we identified a student of PGDM II year to make the presentation.

On March 21, 2002 the presentation was made. The CEO of GNIDA was very impressed by the presentation and he asked me about the presenter. When I told him that he was a student, it was a big surprise for him. That student was Anshul Verma, who later joined BIMTECH as a faculty and worked with us till 2013. Currently Dr Verma is a faculty at SPJIMR, Mumbai, a leading private B-School in India.

The realization of the dream

After the allotment and payment of the land to GNIDA, getting possession of the land was a herculean task. On the plot allotted to us, GNIDA was not in possession due to some litigation with farmers. It took almost two years to get possession of the plot.

Meanwhile, B K Birla ji and Dr (Smt) Sarala Birla ji had made up their mind to develop a state-of-the-art campus. They engaged Shri Pratap Parikh, a leading architect of Delhi who had been working with the B K Birla Group for a long time. Both of them visited many campuses in India including the newly built campus of ISB, Hyderabad. They had visited the ISB Campus to meet their granddaughter Ms Vidula Khaitan who was studying in the first batch of ISB. They had liked some of the features of ISB Campus which they desired to introduce at the proposed campus of BIMTECH as well. On the day of Ram Navmi Day in 2003, I was called to meet Birla ji and Dr (Smt) Sarala Birla at their residence in New Delhi. The Architect Shri Pratap Parikh, Shri RN Jaju, then Chairman, Board of Governors (BoG), BIMTECH and some members of Birla Family were also present. B K Birla ji informed me about his decision to start construction of BIMTECH Campus in Greater Noida. He emphatically asked me "Dr Chaturvedi, what is your commitment for BIMTECH?" I realized the importance of the moment and replied to him immediately, "Babu, I commit for a life-long association with BIMTECH. I will never change my employer henceforth".

Construction at the site started on July 29, 2003 when a Foundation Stone Laying function was organized. Smt Jaya Shree Mohta, elder daughter of Sri & Smt Birla, laid down the foundation stone after performing elaborate pooja. A prominent construction company, OMAX, Delhi was engaged as the civil contractor. With a lot of efforts, construction of the whole campus was completed by August, 2004.

When we were close to the new date of moving i.e. August 19, 2004 to the campus, many doubts arose as some of the basic facilities and requirements of the campus were not ready by then. It was a great dilemma because we had to choose between either the postponement of shifting or facing the ordeal of shifting. After a lot of discussions among the management, faculty and students, ultimately a final decision was taken to shift to the new campus on August 19, 2004.

Creating awareness about Greater Noida has been a decade long exercise. We were very keen to bring eminent people to the new campus. Many a times, industry people from Delhi, Gurgaon and Noida were not willing to visit the campus due to logistic reasons. There was a psychological barrier in the minds of visitors due to poor awareness about the development of Greater Noida as an urban destination. We had to devise different means and methods to get people to the new campus.

During the last 10 years, we could invite some of the greatest intellectual leaders from India and abroad to visit the campus and address our students and faculty. The list includes His Holiness Dalai Lama, Dr APJ Abdul Kalam, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, Shri Yashwant Sinha, Dr Subramnaian Swamy, Shri Jai Ram Ramesh, Shri Oscar Fernandes, Shri Jagdish Khattar, Shri Venu Srinivasan, Shri Vinod Rai, Smt Kiran Bedi, Shri Arvind Kejriwal, Dr Prakash Amte, Shri Mahesh Bhatt, Late Farukh Sheikh, Shri Santosh Desai, Shri Hemant Kanoria, Late Dr Abid Hussain, Dr Pritam Singh, Dr Jagdish Sheth, Prof Saumitra Dutta, Prof M R Rao, Shri Pramath Sinha, Dr Rishikesh T Krishnan, Prof Yashpal, Shri R S Pandey, IAS, Dr Santrupt Mishra, Shri Sam Ghosh, Shri Yogi Shriram and Dr Kiran Karnik.


We had also organized many programmes on performing arts, culture and literature. In partnership with SPIC-Macay, VIRASAT – 2009 was organized in October in which very eminent artists like Ustad Abdul Rashid Khan, Pt Chhannu Lal Mishra, Pt Ronu Mazumdar, Smt Uma Sharma, Guru Singhajit Singh. On many occasions, we have invited eminent artists like Pt Shiv Kumar Sharma, Pt Rajan- Sajan Mishra, Pt Vishwa Mohan Bhatt, Late Habib Tanvir, Shri Asgar Wajahat, Shri Rajendra Nath, Shri Arvind Gaur etc.

VISION 2021- THE ROAD AHEAD

BIMTECH is one of the few B-schools in India which has used vision building very successfully to plan its future. The first vision building exercise started in the year 2000 which took shape as the Vision – 2005. The missions under this vision were to have a residential campus and to be counted among top 25 private B-Schools in India. In 2003 itself, we were ranked 17th by Business Today – AC Nielsen Ranking Survey, while the Greater Noida Campus was launched in August, 2004.

In 2006, we started another exercise to craft a new vision for our institute. After discussions with all the stakeholders, we could formulate the Vision-2011 which stipulated that BIMTECH should become one of the top 10 B-Schools in India and obtain the status of a Deemed University. Again in 2011, we initiated a year-long vision building exercise under the leadership of Prof A Sahay. This time leading deans, directors, researchers and industry experts of the country were also involved along with faculty, staff and alumni. A new Vision-2021 came out of these deliberations. This was published as a document titled "Vision Mission & Values".

ur Founder and Patron, Basant Kumar Birla ji passed away on July 3rd,2019 in Mumbai. There was wide spread and intense grief on his death because he was a giant in the Indian business scene for more than eight decades. He along with his wife Dr. Smt. Sarala Birlaji, had taken up the cause of spreading quality education in all parts of the country. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modiji had also sent a message of condolence to the Birla Family addressing Kumar Mangalam Birla and lauded the great contribution by late B K Birla ji in many fields.

On July 13, 2019 in memory of late Syt. Birla ji, a prayer meeting was organised at Chinmaya Mission, New Delhi which was jointly organised by BIMTECH and Birla Vidya Niketan, New Delhi. The prayer meeting was largely attended by friends, well-wishers and relatives of late B K Birla ji. Teachers and staff of our institute and BVN, were also present in large numbers. The prayer meeting was presided by Shri R N Jaju who has been a close associate of the late Birla ji and was also a former Chairman of the Board of Governors of BIMTECH.

The eminent senior lawyer of the Supreme Court, Dr Abhishek Manu Singhvi was the main obituary speaker on the occasion. In his solemn address, Dr Singhvi spoke about the close association of his parents and himself with Sri B K Birla ji and his wife Dr Smt. Sarala Birla ji. He said although Birla ji was born as a Marwadi, his soul was immersed in the Bengali culture. From his young life, he was interested in arts and culture. Both Sri Birla ji and Dr. Smt. Birlaji were deeply religious people and were close to many religious and spiritual leaders of India like Pt. Ram Kinkar, Swami Akhandan and, Dalai Lama and Swami Chinmay anand. Both of them were greatly influenced by Mahatma Gandhi and Vinoba Bhave. As a matter of fact, their marriage was solemnised by none other than Mahatma Gandhi and Seth Jamnalal Bajaj.





Minakshi Kushwaha, Principal, Birla Vidya Niketan, New Delhi also paid their homage to the departed soul who had inspired them to work in education with commitment for certain values which were core to the legacy of the Birla Family.

10th INDIAN MANAGEMENT CONCLAVE 2019



The 10th Indian Management Conclave (IMC)-2019 was successfully heldon August 2-3, 2019 at IIC, New Delhi which was addressed by the Chief Guest, former President of India, Dr Pranab Mukherji. Two days' conclave was organised by MBA Universe.com. The Education Promotion Society for India(EPSI) and our institute, BIMTECH were engaged in

He hoped that the Draft NEP would provide full autonomy to business schools but at the same time there was some mandate for management institutes to provide free education to needy students from poor families.

They would be allowed to confer degree. A major feature of this Special Session was the release of EPSI & Indian Management

Conclave White paper on the theme of "The Pathway for 5 trillion USD Economy traverses through A Resurgent Higher Education". It was jointly authored by Dr H Chaturvedi and Mr Amit Agnihotri. Senior colleagues Dr Jagdish Shettigar and Prof K K Krishnan have given their valuable inputs.

Some of the key points of the EPSI & IMC Whitepaper were as follows:-

- India will have to repeat its feat of doubling GDP, like it did during the period from 2000 to 2006, when the GDP doubled from \$ 476 billion to \$ 949 billion. This period saw strong spurt in Management and Engineering Education.
- Robust Higher Education focus leading to skilling and employability will help us to become a true services economy

 Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) target of 35% by 2025 and 50% by 2035 is necessary, which only matches that of China and is still half of the US GER.
- 950 Universities need to grow to 1200+ by 2025 to sustain GER growth. Brick and Mortar educational institutions will have to ride the digital highway that DIGITAL INDIA promises to build, reshaping their focus towards distance, online and continuing education in addition to campus programmes.

PLACEMENT REPORT 2018-19



BIMTECH's Centre for Corporate Relations (CCR) performs an enabling and empowering function for its students. Its activities revolve around persuading suitable corporates to the campus, sharing placement related information with students, offering continuous inputs on soft skills, industry/company related knowledge bits, competency enhancing information, holding internship workshop, updation of current events, anchoring and dissemination of question banks generated from campus engagements, initiation and strengthening of student networking with corporates etc.

Curriculum Vitae writing skills, soft skills workshops and arrangement of special lectures by leading recruiters, preplacement talks, sharing of audio, video material to enhance student competencies etc. are also part of CCR's remit.


In the year 2018 we could place 414numbers & opted out 6 numbers of final year students, constituting of 100% of the total strength who offered themselves for the placements, out of a total strength of 420 students.

Compensation

The compensation package was as follows: Highest Indian Salary offered – INR 16.00 LPA, Average Salary offered – INR 8.02 LPA and Minimum Salary offered – INR 6.00 LPA. Highest Foreign Salary offered was INR – 20.00 LPA.

Summer Internships

In the area of summer internships, we had about 210 corporates and organizations who offered three months internships to 420to our first year students. Of this, more than 85% of companies were recommended to students through the institution.

STUDENTS' PROFILE

ADMISSIONS - 2019



Admission process for the academic year 2019-21 started with putting our application online on Sept 5th 2018 and ended with the closure of the last date for fee submission, i.e. on April 18th 2019. It was an enriching journey, we successfully replicated the initiatives from last year - such as early round of WAT/PI process, use of digital/social media, flexible outstation WAT/PI process and student/alumni referral scheme.

The higher number of applications and the pool thereof resulted in selection of a good number of quality candidates, ensuring that all our course seats were full by April 18th, 2019. We had enough surplus admissions to take care of the withdrawals in the subsequent months of April, May and June. As of July 11th 2019, the course wise admissions status is as follows :


The highlight of this admission cycle was a remarkable improvement in the gender diversity, with 194 female students joining across all courses - making the ratio of male:female to 54:46 which happened for the first time in the history of BIMTECH.

Engineering stream dominated the admissions cycle again this year by contributing 37% in the total intake. Students with commerce background were the second biggest contributor with 29% intake; commerce domain otherwise had been dominating the process last year. Our dependency on the northern region further increased to 65% as compared to 58% last year therefore this year we have 35% students coming from non-north region compared to 42% last year. There was also a dilution of number of students coming from the western region this year. The number of students with first division throughout their academic records and work experience saw some improvement as well. There was also a stark increase in number of students with work experience.







Panel Discussion

REDEFINING RETAIL GROWTH STRATEGIES THROUGH HYPER-PERSONALIZATION OF SERVICES



RETAILIA club of BIMTECH organized a panel discussion on the topic "Redefining Retail Growth Strategies through Hyper-Personalization of Services" where the panellists were eminent personalities from the Industry namely Pradeep Sharma, Operations head, MBO Business & E-com, BIBA Apparels. Abhishek Raj, General Manager, Business Development & Operations, Lacoste India, Taranpreet Singh, Co-Founder at Expansion Masters & Business Head- Creative Mud Agency and Shailesh Kandwal, Zonal business manager, Reliance Retail Ltd.

They enlightened the audience about how retailers are connecting with customers and are taking personalization to another level.

It started with the welcome address by Deputy Director, Dr. Anupam Varma. He congratulated the Retail program for completing 15 years. He also appreciated the efforts of Retailia club for successfully completing one year and organizing several intellectual events including today's Panel discussion. He mentioned about significant growth in the retail industry and also explained about the personalized experience in the retail sector which is very gratifying and satisfying. He listed examples of Amazon and Starbucks for their use of artificial intelligence to bridge the gap between data and science.

The discussion was moderated by Dr. Pooja Misra, Chairperson, Retail Management Program who started the discussion with services provided by mom and pop stores. She expressed the interest of the audience through her questions and pondered upon how companies are coming with strategies to have an integrated personalized integration system to provide personalized goods and services. She initiated the discussion by quoting few examples such as how one wants the comfort in driving car with automatic adjustment of seats and how one feels overwhelmed when one receives preferred coffee without even making the order at the coffee shop. Everyone expects things to be personalized and adjusted by their taste preference and color. She further discussed various issues with the panellists such as the challenges one faces in implementing hyper personalization, and the ways the companies are designing their strategies to tap different generations, etcetera. Pradeep Sharma, representing BIBA, explained the rapid shift of consumer buying from brick and mortar stores to online shopping. He also discussed that there are only 1-12% organized retail which dominates the retail sector of the country. He expressed that the biggest challenge faced by retailers with respect to personalization is logistics.

Taranpreet Singh, representing Expansion Masters, began his discussion with the ways companies are transforming and offering personalized goods and services to make the consumer feel special. He shared that 90% of the consumption is done through brick and mortar stores, where each and every person at the store helps in creating personalized services. He also quoted the example of Amazon Go that how they already know about customers' previous preferences.

Shailesh Kandwal, representing Reliance, mentioned the key to any business is to be flexible and ready to modify themselves according to customer preferences. He shared the importance of personalization and how it is evolving from centuries and has become an important and integral component of the retail industry.

Abhishek Raj, representing Lacoste, shared his views as to how this era is defined by personalization and not hyperpersonalization in both organized and unorganized sector. He also explained that bridging the gap between expectation and delivery is the need of the hour to understand customer behaviour. He shared the challenges faced by companies with respect to data integration.

It was followed by Question and Answer session from students. It was a very enriching session for students where students also got an opportunity to interact with the panellists and received a platform for network building. The discussion ended with a Vote of Thanks by Dr. Pankaj Priya, Area head, Marketing and Retail.

CAPITALIZING UPON THE EMERGING TRENDS IN AFRO-ASIA REGION: IN QUEST OF PROFITABLE AND SUSTAINABLE GROWTH

held at Noida Radisson Hotel (IBM Programme)





Birla Institute of Management Technology(BIMTECH) along with the Cairo based Federation of Afro –Asian Insurers & Reinsurers (FAIR) organized a two day seminar from 23rd-24th April, 2019 on the theme "Capitalizing on the Emerging Trends in Insurance in Afro- Asian Region: In Quest of Profitable and Sustainable Growth" recently at Radisson Blue Hotel, Noida (NCR).

In the welcome address, Prof (Dr.)Harivansh Chaturvedi, Director BIMTECH, dwelled on the pervading common issues of risk management affecting both Asia and Africa. Prof Chaturvedi strongly advocated the use of modern technological tools like Machine Learning, Insuretech, Artificial Intelligence and Internet of Things (IOT) to solve problems. He reminded the audience about the lurking uncertainty and risk looming large all around us as we live in the VUCA (Volatile, Uncertain, Complex and Ambiguous) world.

Ms. Heba Fouad, Assistant General Secretary –FAIR enunciated the role played by FAIR in developing the culture of insurance and risk management in the entire Afro-Asian region. Mr K K Mishra, former Managing Director of Tata AIG General Insurance Co. Ltd, in his keynote address, articulated the central role played by FAIR in the growth of Insurance business and risk culture in the Afro-Asian region since its inception.

Dr. Shelina Afroza, the effervescent Chairman –Jiban Bima Corporation, Bangladesh felt that the emerging trends, development in risk management should be reconciled with the scale of Insurance industry, for it impacts the overall growth and development of Bangladesh. The first panel discussion of the day was "Making Life Insurance Protection Accessible to All". This session was chaired by Dr. M. Mosharraf Hossain, Member Life – Insurance Development & Regulatory Authority (IDRA) Bangladesh and moderated by Prof. Manoj K Pandey of BIMTECH. Dr. Hossain presented an extensive account of the state of the life insurance penetration & density across the entire Afro-Asian region while chairing the session. Mr. Girish Kulkarni, MD and CEO, Sun Union Dai-Chi Life Ins, In his inimitable style maintained that the social fabric of the Afro-Asian region is one of the major inhibiting factors affecting the penetration of life insurance and went on to add that the involuntary close family bonding assuring financial support in turn, often deter the families from going for life insurance. Mr. Trevor Bull, MD and CEO Aviva Life Insurance Co. India Ltd lamented the lack of insurance awareness &strongly recommended the introduction of financial awareness curriculum at school level itself. Ms. Kalpana Sampat, COO, DHFL Pramerica Life Insurance Company spoke about the growing use of digital technology.

Mr. Kapil Mehta, Co-founder Secure Now Insurance Broker gave emphasis on promoting term assurance genre of insurance plans to address the issue of protection gap. The second panel discussion on "Health Insurance Protection -An opportunity to Expand" was chaired by Mr. Warendra Sinha, MD & CEO of IFFCO Tokio General Insurance Company



Ltd. While initiating the discussion, Mr. Sinha pointed out how over the years, the profile of the general insurance business has undergone a massive change over. Prof (Dr) Abhijit Chattorai, Chairperson-Insurance Business Programme of BIMTECH, while moderating the panel discussion, elucidated the difference between health protection gap and other protection gaps while taking forward the discussion. Ms Malti Jaswal, Senior Consultant, World Bank Group, strongly felt that Modicare would increase health insurance penetration in India. Dr. Nishant Jain, Programme Director, Indo-German Social Security Programme at GIZ explained in details the success of Thailand UHC model. He felt that political will was the main reason behind the success of UHC in Thailand. Mr. Praveen Yadav, COO, MD India Healthcare Services felt that the enrolment in most schemes suffered primarily because of the involvement of private agencies. Dr. Kholoud Elshafie, Medical Insurance Consultant, Suez Canal Life Insurance talked about I TC.

The last session of the day was on "InsureTech: Have They Been Up To the Challenge?" This session was chaired by Dr. Rakesh Agarwal, Editor, The Insurance Times. The moderator for the session was Prof. K. K. Krishnan of PGDM-IBM BIMTECH. Dr. Agarwal lucidly described changing trends in customer perception.

Speaking on the subject, Mr. Raghunathan, Head – Insurance Consulting and Transformation, Larsen & Toubro Infotech drew attention to the necessity for accuracy in primary data for effective pattern recognition. Mr. Inderjeet Sen, CEO, Krish Mark Pvt. Ltd, expounded the rise of new digital companies. Mr. Ashutosh Shrotriya, Senior VP, Religare expanded on the adoption of such technologies for fraud detection. Mr. J. H. Saadeh, General Manager, ESKADENIA Software, UAE, explicated about the adoption at the insuretech in GCC countries.



The fourth panel discussion of the seminar was on the theme-"Reinsurance: Coping up with worsening Nat Cat environment". The subject was introduced by Mr. Praveen Gupta, former MD & CEO, Raheja QBE General Insurance Co Ltd. Mr. Gupta articulated his views on the effects of climate change vis-à-vis the Nat Cat events and the carbon footing. Mr Kingshuk Chakraborty, Senior Underwriter-P&C, Hannover Risk SE took pains to simplify and explain the effects of Nat Cat on reinsurance arrangements. Mr Praveen Vashistha, CEO & MD, Howden India, gave a vivid picture of state of affairs of insurance business in the Afro-Asian region. He also threw light on the Cat modelling and talked about protection gap, the accumulation, free capital and loose capital, in the context.

Mr Samiran Lahiri, ED & CEO (Principal Officer), Preferred Partners Insurance Brokers Pvt Ltd ventilated his views on the general Nat Cat situation in Asia and the emerging Alternative Risk Techniques (ARTs). Mr Abhijit Datar, Chief Underwriting Officer, AGCS India, was more specific about the major property and engineering losses in Asian context.

REALIZING ASPIRATIONS, INTERESTS AND BRILLIANCE OF YOUNG WOMEN (RAINBOW)

As part of Situation Analysis each RAINBOW partner organized a Focus Group Discussion (FGD) of experts who have a rich experience in the field of women careers and women entrepreneurship. On April 12th 2019, BIMTECH's FGD hosted 8 experts from diverse backgrounds and heterogeneous fields of

experience. This enabled a multidimensional opinions and experiences sharing on the issues and challenges that lead to lesser women participating in the workforce than men with similar educational qualifications. With detailed Situation analysis involving more than 50 subject matter experts and by involving survey method for data collection from female students enrolled in Universities/ HEIs and female alumni of Indian Partners, project is gradually moving towards the completion of its first work package (WP1) of situation analysis.

II Project meeting was held at University of Jyvaskyla, School of Business and Economics JSBE, Finland form May 27th -29th 2019. Dean Hanna-Leena Pesonen welcomed all partners and conveyed her best wishes for the success and impactful presence of the project both in European countries and in India. It was followed by a Roundtable Discussion on the topic, "Career counselling to tackle women's challenges in Career". SuviHeikkinen and Anna-MaijaLämsä highlighted some practical arrangements for the meeting. Dr. Johanna Rantanen, Senior Lecturer in Career Guidance and Counselling, University of Jyväskylä presented some



tools of exploring career guidance needs of university students. Prof. Himanshi Tiwari presented summary of Focus Group results of all 6 partners and survey results of data collected through survey instrument in India. All partners shared some good practices and examples for preparing training material for further intervention. This initiated the discussion on content drafts of the trainings material and Career Counselling and Guidance Handbook.

Till now it has been a truly learning and engaging journey for the partners of this project. Together we know that careers of women will take a colourful turn because of research and counselling interventions.

BUSINESS SCHOOL IMPACT SYSTEM-BIMTECH'S JOURNEY FROM QUALITY TO IMPACT

EFMD Annual Conference, Lisbon

he primary purpose of a B-School is to produce professional managers, provide responsible education, and deliver useful research. In doing so, the schools create an impact on their community. The common approach to business schools impact rely on academic publications in ranked journals, their citations and alumni salaries. But in reality, the impact is on multiple stakeholders with divergent expectations- for example how it is creating an impact for academics, students, private organizations, media, government and public sector. That means we need a wider lens to explore impact that the b-school creates.

In the vision statement of BIMTECH two phrases 'Entrepreneurial mind-set' and 'Sustainability and inclusive growth' demand very careful assessment for their impact on stakeholders. During past few years we have been concerned about finding a proper method for the impact assessment. As one of the long-time members of Principles of Responsible Management Education (PRME), we felt that we must strive to monitor the Academic, Managerial and Societal impacts of the institute so as to contribute by aligning with some of the sustainable development goals of the United Nations. With this background, BIMTECH decided to assess the nature and extent of impact on its immediate environment through Business School Impact System (BSIS) offered by European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD), which is one of the top three reputed accreditation bodies. The core purpose of the BSIS process is to assess the nature and extent of the impact of the initiatives of a Business School on its immediate environment. It measures the B-School's contribution at the local level that helps to communicate with its financial, social and political stakeholders in the impact zone. It also helps in testing how well the school is achieving its objectives for local impact.

BIMTECH submitted its report providing all the data and related information to measure impact of school on the region through its engagement within the region. As a part of the process date was collected for Financial, Educational, Business Development, Intellectual, Eco System, CSR and Image impacts. The less tangible areas concerning the influence were brought out through factual evidences, anecdotes, and deep ties with stakeholders in the region. With 7 criteria and 120 indicators, the BSIS framework covered all the activities a b-school is engaged with.

Criteria 1- Financial impact Criteria 2 Educational impact Criteria 3- Business development impact Criteria 4- Intellectual impact Criteria 5- Impact within the regional ecosystem Criteria 6- Societal impact Criteria 7- Impact on the image of the region

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Following the report a 3 member expert team visited BIMTECH on April 15- 16 to have a detailed discussion with BIMTECH Board members, faculty, staff, students, regional organizations and alumni

Ultimately the hard work put in by the team and with the support of the BSIS experts BIMTECH could earn the distinction of being the first institute in India to be awarded the EFMD BSIS Label in June 2019 at a glittering annual conference of EFMD held at Lisbon, the beautiful capital of Portugal.

During the conference, book titled "Quality, Accreditation & Ranking: A Silent Revolution in the Offing in Indian Higher Education"edited by Dr Chaturvedi, Director BIMTECH was also released by Prof Eric Cornuel, CEO, EFMD.

Dr Chaturvedi was one of the panellists in the session "What is the local impact of international partnerships?" The other panellists included Alice Guilhon, Dean, Skema Business School, France; José Varejão, Research Fellow, University of Porto, Portugal.
